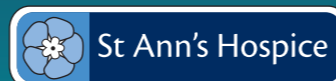

About St Ann's Hospice

Greater Manchester's largest adult hospice

With three locations, St Ann's Hospice is one of the largest adult hospices in the UK. We've been operating for around 40 years, and our free services help over 3,000 people every year across much of Greater Manchester.

What is hospice care?

We help people from the age of 16, who need to have complex symptoms and pain controlled by our multidisciplinary team of specialist palliative care professionals. Our expertise can often enable people to get more out of life. We aim to look after the 'whole needs of the whole person', including not just medical and nursing care, but also spiritual, emotional, social and psychological support. *We don't just provide end-of-life care: around 40% of our patients return home after receiving help from us.*



Our services

Patient admissions

Patients are admitted following a referral from a hospital consultant, GP or specialist nurse. Although people often associate hospice care with cancer, we help people with a wide range of conditions, and also provide both terminal care and care following hospital treatment such as radiotherapy and chemotherapy.

Day therapy

While living at home, patients may access day therapy services as an outpatient. Following referral, patients are assessed and an agreed package of care is developed which is specific to their needs. This may include pain and symptom control – and also access to a wide range of supportive services.

Community support

More and more people wish to be cared for at home, so in some areas of Salford and Trafford we can bring a range of our services to the person – and our aim is to extend this service when and where possible.

Support for carers

Being a carer can be emotionally and physically draining, so we can help with a range of services to help make things easier during a demanding time.



Helping St Ann's Hospice

How we are funded

Only a third of our funding comes from the NHS – the rest comes from donations and fundraising activities. To provide our level of care, we need to raise £16,000 each day.
