CHANGES IN CIRCUMSTANCES

Your Will needs to be reviewed regularly – preferable about once every five years; as we all know, lives change and this can often affect your family circumstances. Taxation laws may change too, and all of these things need to be taken into consideration on a regular basis.

For instances, you may need to change your Will if you have recently married, separated, divorced, moved house or there has been a birth in the family or the death of a friend or family member.

Remember! If you marry, any Will you have will automatically be revoked unless it was specifically made in contemplation of that marriage.
