About St Ann's Hospice

St Ann's is the largest and one of the oldest hospices in the country. We provide specialist care and support to a wide population across Greater Manchester and parts of Cheshire. We look after people aged 18 and over who are impacted by life-limiting illness. Care is provided at our hospice sites in Heald Green and Little Hulton as well as in the place people call home, supported by a range of community and outreach services.

Introducing our strategy

Our strategy builds on the previous version and will outline our ambitions and what we aspire to achieve during the next five years.

St Ann's has been at the centre of providing specialist palliative and end-of-life care for over half a century. People matter and we believe in putting patients first and delivering innovative care that is driven by our clinical strategy. Care is provided in a safe and inclusive environment by expert teams, supported by cross-sector collaboration, research and education. Care is tailored to the individual and is goal-specific to meet the complex needs of the person and those closest to them at any stage of illness, regardless of the diagnosis. Care is delivered at our hospices or can be accessed from other community settings.

- We will listen to, engage with and consider the voice of those using our services to further enhance our clinical services

- We will continue to develop our collaborative relationships with supporters and colleagues within the health and social care networks to enhance their financial contribution to care and service provision
